E 66/39	Sauvages de la Croix (François Boissier de). Letter to Professor Robert Whytt, asking for a copy of a new medical work by Whytt, probably his <u>Observations on the nature ... of those disorders ... commonly called nervous, etc.</u> (Edin., 1765) and sending four medical theses of which he was (de Sauvages) was presses, with wrappers and seal. Montpelier, 1 May 1765. Also 'Copie de toutes les lettres que j'ay (M. de Valmont) recu de son Excellence Monsieur de Melville Gouverneur General des Iles Godeloupes et de Pendemas etc.' 1760. General Robert Melville (1723-1809) was governor of Guadeloupe in 1760. There are copies of 20 letters, certificated by De Valmont's signature.
